Grand Opening of Maelog Footpath

The recently completed boardwalk footpath on the west side of Maelog Lake was officially opened in July by the Chair of the Council, Aled Morris Jones, the leader of the Community Council, Evan Owen and representatives from the Countryside Commission Wales, the Isle of Anglesey Council and the Coastal Path Development Group. Also in attendance were team members from the Project Rhosneigr group, landowners that have property adjoining the lake and members of the public.

Your local Community Council had instigated the concept of improving the Maelog Lake paths some time ago and supported the proposals put forward by the Coastal Path Development Group. The Project Rhosneigr team were pleased to co-ordinate the first phase of the path enhancement. The new boardwalk is approximately 300 metres long and made entirely of wood that blends in well with the surroundings. Each wooden tread is coated in a non-slip material making the path safe even in wet weather. At the end of the path is a seating area overlooking a picturesque view of the lake with the Snowdonia mountain range as a

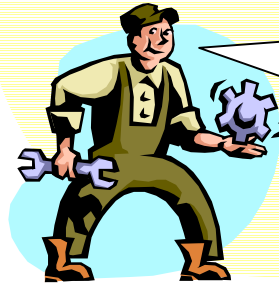
100 Year Old School
